NORCEMOG AGM MINUTES – 15th April 2012

The Annual General meeting was held at The Royal Oak, Garstang. 24 members were present and the meeting commenced at 14:00. (After another excellent lunch).

Apologies - were received from Nick & Janet Taylor, Margaret Martin, Andy Bleasdale and Colin Hill.

Secretary's Report – Eddy Brandon who was attending his first meeting of Norcemog was welcomed. 2011 had had a full programme of events and it was disappointing that many of them were poorly attended. The committee had tried to ensure that events and meetings were in line with what the members wanted and the AGM was the opportunity for members to have their say collectively on the content of the 2012 programme of events.

It was encouraging that the response to the request for volunteers to take on the responsibility for organising Noggins in 2012 had been excellent and all dates are filled. In some cases the details need finalising and this will be discussed later.

The committee had met 4 times during the year and the minutes of the meetings published in the Newsletter. Members should feel free to contact their committee members to seek clarification of the minutes if necessary or to ask for matters to be raised at future meetings.

Treasurer's Report – Copies of the accounts were distributed which showed virtually the same balance as last year. This included monies from the sale of regalia resulting in a reduced value of stock held. So far only 13 members had paid their 2012 subs and when the remaining expected subs had been received the accounts would show a healthy balance.

Election of Officers – All Officers need to be elected each year. 2 proposals for committee members had been received and all existing members had agreed to stand again. This resulted in the proposed 2012 being as below, which was accepted by a vote of members present.

Awards Presentation – Most awards are presented at the event where they are won. However, we do another “annual” awards which had traditionally been presented at the Norcemog Dinner Dances. The committee had decided that rather than take up time at an event where time between dinner and dance was short, in future awards would be presented at the Christmas Party. Due to the change of venue and format of the last Christmas Party the awards were not presented and instead would be presented here at The AGM.

The awards to be presented are the Scriptwriters Award in recognition of the contribution made toward the content of the Newsletter and the “Layshaft” given to the member who in the opinion of the committee had the most memorable “bump” during in the year. Roy Wilkinson won both of these awards for 2011, for his Newsletter reports and for his nerve tingling performance in the 2011 Autotest. The presentation was made by Susan Bleasdale accompanied by hearty applause from the members present.

2012/13 Diary of Events – During 2011 attendances at events were very disappointing. If this was because events were of the wrong type now was the opportunity to change that. It is most disappointing for members to organise events and then get very little interest. The Autotest and Gymkhana were examples, where only 3 or 4 entrants competed. These events take time and effort to organise involving Safety Cases, Permits, Course design, marshals and acquisition of a suitable venue. We are a motoring club and should support motoring events.

Drive it Day is on Sunday 22nd April and 9 Norcemog cars will be joining in with Yorkshire, LinMog and NorMog in a drive to Tann Hill. 60+ cars are expected.

John Alden is organising the May Noggin and so far has received no reservations, members present said they would check their diaries and contact John if they could attend. It was agreed to go ahead with the event even with a small number.

Martin Cocks is organising the free passes for The Tatton Park Classic and Performance Car Show. To date 13 of the 16 passes have been allocated but we have had to open the event up to the MSCC nationally and to the 3 Wheeler club. (only 6 of the 13 are Norcemog members).

Bryan Rawlinson has found a new venue for the Autotest and Concours which will be held at The Commercial Vehicle Museum in Leyland. Isobel commented that the Museum is very interesting and well worth a visit. To make this event a success we need a reasonable number of entrants (more than the 3 we got last year). This is a test of driving skills with a “fun” element. Members should be assured that they are not going to damage their cars or be asked to race around squealing tyres. If you are really unsure go along and watch and if tempted enter on the day, but a least go along and tell Bryan that you will be doing so.

We have 10 free passes for Arley Hall Garden Festival, so far none have been requested. This is an opportunity to display your pride and joy right in front of Arley Hall and get a free pass to do it. Contact Geoff Mizon if you want a pass (After the meeting 5 passes were given out).

Andy and Sue are organising the Noggin to be held at The Brockhall Nature Reserve in July. Sue explained that an entry/parking fee of £5 per car would be charged. A general consensus was that the venue was well worth visiting having several walks to experience the flora and fauna within the reserve. There was a restaurant as well as several picnic areas with tables.

Martin Cocks was arranging the free passes for the Oulton Park Classic Car Show/Race in July. This is not the Gold Cup, but is a new event for us to be invited to and is organised by the same people who organise the Tatton Park Show. Paddock passes will entitle holders to have a lap or two around the track at lunch time before the racing starts.

Bryan and Linda Fearn are organising the August Noggin. Bryan asked what type of event the members wanted. In his limited experience it seemed that visits to historic buildings were popular but he asked if a scenic run would be preferred. Members supported the idea of a run to an historic building including a tour preceded or followed by a lunch would be ideal.

Geoff Mizon was arranging for passes for the Oulton Park Gold Cup over the August Bank Holiday and reminded members that this year in order to qualify for a free pass and all that goes with it your car had to have been registered before 1980. It was also expected that drivers and their passengers would wear period dress appropriate to the age of their car.

In September we have a visit to The Anderton Boat Lift which connects the Trent and Mersey Canal with the River Weaver at Anderton, just outside Northwich, being arranged by Andrew and Joan Threlkeld. We have to be there by 10:00 to use the lift before it opens for canal/river traffic and if we get more than 20 attending we will get a private trip on the River Weaver.

An Autumn Retreat has been organised for the weekend of 19-21 October at The Palace Hotel, Buxton. This where the 2010 National Event was based. We have managed to get very competitive rates for 20 rooms and plan the event to be for Norcemog only. Keep an eye on the Newsletter for further details.

Roy and Barbara offered to organise the November Noggin and suggested a trip to Boundary Mill with lunch at the Fish and Chip Restaurant opposite. They were planning on have members of the MG Club there too to give the men something to do whilst their other halves were taking retail therapy. The members asked them to go ahead with this.

The Christmas Party was discussed at some length. It was recognised that our membership had aged and that the parties which we all enjoyed in the past with children, a Father Christmas giving out presents and carol singing was no longer possible. This came to a head last year when at short notice we had to cancel our booking of Barnacre Village Hall and have a Christmas Lunch at a local restaurant. It was also agreed to hold the event further south in order to be nearer to more of our members in a hope that this would encourage a larger attendance. With this in mind Roy and Barbara offered to investigate the possibility of holding a lunchtime Christmas Party at the Mollington Banistre near Chester.(Where we went for our dinner dance 2 years ago). They were asked to get a rates for people to stay overnight either before or after the lunch or both.

Looking forward David Haynes asked if any members were interested in a European Trip in 2013. He said that if so he would be happy to take on the organising of such a trip, but he would have to start planning soon. So if you are interested contact David and tell him. 2012 Drive It Day 22 April

The weather on Sunday morning confirmed the forecast, so the hood was erected. Geoff had emailed round his route back from Hawes the previous week, and due comparison with the map enabled a timely journey there, allowing time to investigate where exactly the Creamery was. Everyone else seemed to have read only part of the sign that also said 200 yards on as well, and as a consequence had spent time touring a car park!

It was similarly difficult to detect the discrete lane by which to leave Hawes and head for Tan Hill, but once on it, the road provided an interesting, if somewhat bleak journey, with the persistent rain adding to the experience. Arrival at Tan Hill along with a substantial number of other Morgans, and access to warmth, a drink and a comfortable armchair was only a temporary period of relaxation, however. The success of the ploy to entice Morgans from all of the surrounding centres had led to a significant degree of overcrowding, and this was to be overcome by having those used to the bracing experience of open air driving reliving this freshness in the substantially less comfortable, and enormously less warm, or even welcoming, ambience of the barn – still redolent of Christmas decorations, and, until some helpful soul pulled back the shutters, rather dimly lit as well.

The dispersal of the food, ordered in advance, was similarly challenging. Those of us who had ordered the Yorkshire pudding were served first, but there was a wait for the lasagne, some of which was less warm than it might have been, and as for the poor soul who ordered the burger, he was able to confirm that everyone else in the room – about 80 all told – were all ready for their sticky toffee pudding or apple crumble before his offering appeared. The puddings were served with increased alacrity, though, and then the tea and coffee, and the indomitable Morgan spirit seemed to make light of the inconveniences.

And all of the time, it rained, leading to consideration of alternative return routes. We descended from the height of Tan Hill – according to the writing on the wall, at 1237 feet above sea level – towards Kirby Steven, and thence to the M6, where, miraculously, it was dry. By the time we got onto the M55, it was sunny as well! And the return journey took no longer than the outward one, either.

Lest you are left with the impression that the day was dreary from start to finish, in support of your preference never to attend, despite continuing to pay for membership, I can assure you that it was a really good day out, and we were able to laugh off all of the setbacks, even the indigestions. Tan Hill is worth another visit – in the dry, hopefully.

CHOLMONDELEY PAGEANT OF POWER

15th 16th 17th JUNE 2012



The High Peak Centre (TORMOG) has once again secured an invite to the world famous Cholmondeley Pageant of Power. This event although smaller, is very similar to the Goodwood Festival of Speed.

The 2012 Pageant of Power will be held on June 15th -17th, a whole month earlier than the event's normal slot in July. Analysis of the weather patterns at this location, over the last 10 years showed July is a third wetter than June and so the decision was made to bring the fifth Pageant of Power forward a month to June.



All Centres are welcome to join TORMOG at this celebration of power and speed held in the south Cheshire countryside. The event takes place at Cholmondeley Castle, which is situated on the A49 between Warrington to Shrewsbury. (postcode for Sat Nav is SY14 8AH) There are excellent links to the motorway network and road closures in operation.

We have a gazebo type shelter which will offer protection in the hopefully unlikely event of inclement weather.

You can display your Morgan on our club pitch situated directly alongside the track or simply attend the event in any vehicle and park in the main car park. Whichever you choose, we have a special club rate which could save you 60% on the normal ticket price. You must be however book before the 31st March 2012.

The programme of racing from classic saloons, sports cars and single seaters will be complemented by a plethora of period activities and a period-themed venue following significant investment in the event from circuit owner MotorSport Vision (MSV).

The organisers are inviting clubs to help create a unique atmosphere on the infield of the circuit and want this to mirror the era represented by the cars on the track. To do so, this year free infield passes will only be issued to vehicles manufactured before 1980. All other vehicles will only be able to enter via our regular public entrances at East Gate and Knickerbrook. Having purchased entry tickets (see below for prices).

It is hoped that drivers and passengers will enter into the spirit of the event by dressing in 1960s and 70s period costume. As an incentive, all those dressed accordingly will benefit from exclusive access to a grid walk before a race on the Sunday and Monday, where you'll be free to roam around the cars, meet the drivers and enjoy live music. (This sounds like an attempt to create an "Oulton Park Revival")

There will also be a track parade on the Sunday morning where you'll have the opportunity to take your vehicle around the Oulton Park circuit before the racing commences. This will be open to all display cars which fit our infield criteria, but only if the driver and passengers are suitably attired!

Anyone bringing a car for display will receive free of charge admission and a vehicle pass. Any additional passengers attending will need to purchase tickets, which are available at the following prices:

£21 per adult on the gate each day (£17 booked in advance)

£15 per senior on the gate each day (senior tickets are not available in advance)

Children 12 and under go free
