Reflections on 52 years with Morgans Part 7 – Restoration Course.

In 2000, shortly after I retired, I spotted an advert for a vehicle restoration course at Preston College and decided to apply. This was a lot less easy than it sounds, since there appeared to be a prerequisite for applicants to be in receipt of some benefit or other and it took a bit of time to overcome this particular hurdle. Nevertheless, perseverance paid off and I was able to enrol on the two year programme.

We were taught welding, metalwork and bodywork skills, painting and health and safety. Initially, we had to work on vehicles supplied by the college and although the course was only 15 hours a week, this qualified as full time, and I was assigned a mentor! After a while, we were able to work on projects of our own and I took advantage of this to reskin the doors and weld up the front wings and then resprayed them all. I also made a rear wheel cover and a dash board.

At the end of the two years, it was possible to enrol again, so that in all I was there for six years, along with a number of other perpetual students. I am the proud recipient of NVQs and City & Guilds certificates for welding, spray painting and health & safety. And even now, some ten years after my prolonged attendance on the course was completed, my fellow students and I are still meeting twice a year to reminisce and compare notes on the projects we are doing
