Morgans & Malt – Does it get any better? Part 2

A NorceMog guide to a Scottish Island Tour with Scotch!

Our holiday for 2014 was an Islands & Whisky tour on the east coast of Scotland with Ruby, our Morgan. This missive is a summary of our experience which may act as a guide should you wish to plan something similar.

Previously on Morgans & Malt – The last edition gave details of our trip to Islay, return ferry to the mainland and a visit to Oban Distillery – See November newsletter for details. Essential! – Before you go join the Diageo 'Friends of Classic Malt'. You can register here <u>https://www.malts.com/en-gb/friends-of-the-classic-malts/</u> You get free tours of the distilleries in the Diageo group (partner free as well in most cases or you can both join!) and a Malt Map which gives a description of the 4 principle tastes – Delicate, Light, Rich and Smokey. Isle of Mull was the next ferry crossing from Oban to Craignure. The roads on Mull are not Morgan friendly, to say the least, and many are single track with passing places. Take care in the passing place lay-bys. They were awful when we were there in 2014.

The best bits of Mull are Tobermory – It has a distillery and the setting for the children's TV

programme Balamory and a good base to visit of Staffa (Fingal's Cave) and Iona. Shortest to Iona is from Fionnphort however we went Killiemor and called at Staffa 'on the way.' Broadford, Portree and Dunvegan are popular destinations with accommodation and if you fancy something more upmarket you could stay at the world famous restaurant The Three Chimneys which also has 5-star accommodation or at Kinloch Lodge, another Michelin starred restaurant!

The Cuillin Hills are a popular destination for walkers and the island is very dependent on tourism. On the route to

Useful Information

In total we used 5 ferries on 4 different routes. If we go again we would enquire about an island hopper ticket from Caledonian MacBrayne which we think can be tailored to your itinerary and would save money compared to the scheduled tickets. More details can be found here <u>www.calmac.co.uk</u>. They operate all the ferry services available except the Islay to Jura ferry which is a local operator.
