. Norcemog Borders 500 tour 2019

This was our first road trip with our Morgan and it was with excitement when we opened up our package from Scenic Car tours. Nice folder containing maps, directions, places of interest, basically all we could need. The final planning stage started.

Monday 2nd September 2019 was the departure date for the Norcemog Scottish Borders tour. Prior to that day the weather forecast was closely monitored to see what clothing was required to be packed for the days away. As it turned out it was to be wet weather gear.

Monday morning came (some stayed near Carlisle on the Sunday night) and we arranged that we would all meet at the Hogs Head Inn at Alnwick on Monday night.

Day 1

We left home (near Preston) and decided on a scenic route via Settle, Hawes, Askrigg and over to Barnard Castle. The roads from Hawes to Barnard castle were superb driving roads, extremely quiet and will definitely be on our 'return to' roads at some stage. The drive up was good, if not wet in places. The roof was up and down 3 times during the journey.

We were the last to arrive at The Hogs Head Inn where we met up with Linda and Brian (Fearn) Roy and Jean (Senior), Peter and Isobel (Moore) and Steve and Vivien (Grunner). Unfortunately Andrew and Joan had to return home to deal with family issues, so there were only 5 Morgans, a plus 8, a 4/4 and 3 plus 4's. Day 2

We all set off at the same time and the destination being The Best Western Hotel, Moffat. There was a

We headed off to Holy Island before venturing over the border into Scotland and headed towards Moffat. Looking ahead we saw rain coming in over the hills. 

Just walking around the track you cannot help but be impressed by the fine selection of classic cars on display. On the Sunday there was a 'proper' Concours exhibition with many fine examples of classic cars from the 1920's through to the 1960's.

Following on from the success of the event, the Morgan Centenary Roadster 100 Register is pleased to announce that the sixth All Morgans Day will be on 7th June 2020 at Blenheim Palace.
