Why did I win the Layshaft Award?

Or How I caused an international incident between Italy and France. By Roger Benton

Being such a sought after award I thought I should justify why I am a worthy recipient

of the Layshaft award.

We had travelled over the Alps in glorious sunshine with hoods down and, in my case, side screens off. Liguria then on to Tuscany staying in wonderful self-catering apartments set amongst fields of grapevines.



But the Italian roads were not exactly smooth, the first hint of a problem was a little red

warning symbol indicating an 'Overseer Fault'. Apparently the 'Overseer' detects locking of the rear wheels and then puts the gearbox in neutral. I switched off and then start the engine, warning had gone.

Same warning reappeared the next day but this time it wouldn't go away. Called Morgan and they suggested leaving it for 15miniutes which cured the issue.

We were then heading North to Pisa, stopped for lunch and the warning reappeared so I park up somewhere safe and switched off but this time on trying to restart, the car was completely dead except for the wipers! First call was to the AA then on WhatsApp to let my fellow travellers know, then a call to Morgan. Within 30 minutes two other Morgans were with me. Morgan suggested disconnecting the battery for 15 minutes but no joy. Freddy (owner of the most beautiful +8 I have ever seen) produced a circuit tester and made sure the fuses were ok.

By now the tow truck should have been here so I rang the AA. The driver of the tow truck had tried to contact me but failed so had turned round and gone home. The AA requested the tow truck again and the same thing happened, the AA gave me the telephone number of the driver but gave me the wrong number. Eventually the tow truck turned up, 7 hours after the initial call.

My car is an automatic, with no engine running the car is stuck in park so the rear wheels are locked. To put the car on the pickup plastic skids were placed under the rear wheels and my poor car was dragged backwards on to the low loader.

I was informed that it could take a month for my car to be recovered to the UK. I wasn't really expecting it to make it in one piece. An annoying quirk of the AA recovery service is that they arrange to recover the car but not the driver so it was a taxi to the hotel.





The next day David Roberts (thank heaven for David and his Italian) and myself visited the garage where my car had been taken and this was the first encouraging sign. The garage was immaculate with high end cars such as Lamborghinis and Audi's on the ramps and a concourse condition MGA restored by the owner. Lots of discussion and a bottle of whiskey seem to help motivate the owner to try and fix my car. I wasn't hopeful of a fix especially when the garage owner informed us that the diagnostic socket and software was specific to Morgan and not available to him.

However, this garage was very good, in less than a day and half they had fixed the problem.

The garage had traced the issue to a wire connecting two fuse boards, the connections had come loose. I safely returned home in my car and the Overseer has never again reared its ugly head.

But this story is not quite over, back in the UK I complained to the AA. Two weeks later I had a call from a nice AA customer services agent. I recounted what had happened and

the agent said this was the worst example of poor service they had ever seen. I was offered compensation of £150 which I accepted. The agent then said the issue was between the coordinating office based in Lyon in France and the Italian Automobile club and that the two spoke different languages but the Italian office didn't answer the phone anyway. An investigation had been undertaken and things became a little heated, the Italians insulted the French causing an international incident so this whole issue was reported to a higher authority. What happened next I don't know but I suppose one could envisage the higher authority being referred to as the 'Overseer'.

I must pay tribute to my fellow travellers; their support made all the difference and I can't thank them enough.

High speed ferry back to Liverpool, Homeward bound, we have enough fuel, Thank you SCCT, what a star, From Joanny and me and our Morgan car.



















A Morgan 4/4 History Revealed


Many Norcemog members will know of, or have seen the 1960 4/4 Series II that I rebuilt between 2017 and 2022. Some members may remember reading that this car has been in my family since 1967 when my brother-in-law purchased the car. This same car was the first Morgan that I rode in, over half a century ago! So, when friends send me an interesting photograph from the early 1960s, it's difficult not to be excited!

September 2024. Argiris Nicolaou, son of Andreas Nicolaou, proprietor of the Cyprus Classic Motorcycle Museum based at Nicosia and owner of a 1957 Morgan 4/4 Series II, unearthed the following period photograph online.



My Morgan 4/4 Series II, was ordered by Morgan's agent for Cyprus, H. Sabri Tahir of Kryenia and was dispatched from Morgan's Pickersleigh Road factory on Monday 29th February 1960 with ivory white body and wings, black interior, tonneau cover and badge bar. It spent the first two years of its life on the Mediterranean island of Cyprus. The agent, H. Sabri Tahir, a Cypriot Turkish businessman with reputation for being a bit of a rogue. Tahir sold a fourteen Morgans between 1959 and 1965, virtually all British armed forces personnel who were able to take advantage of generous tax exemptions afforded to them. Of the 388 4/4 Series II cars manufactured, H. Sabri Tahir supplied five; A552 is one of two 4/4 Series II Cyprus cars known to survive.

Sabri Tahir had rather an interesting life. In addition to being the agent for Morgan, he was obviously a bit of an 'entrepreneur', owned bars and hotels and was renowned for operating 'at the edge of the law'. He befriended the author Lawrence Durrell (brother of Gerald Durrell of 'My Family and Other Animals' fame' and assisted him with the purchase and restoration of a house in the northern part of Cyprus, now Turkish Cyprus. After the invasion and annexation by the Turkish military of Cyprus'



north east area and in influx of the Turkish mafia, there followed a number of attempts on his life, one of which was a car bomb that injured him sufficiently that he had to use a wheelchair, his son was assassinated in one of his hotels in 1981, finally, in 2000, Sabri Tahir, aged 76, was assassinated by a former bodyguard with six shots to the head. He obviously led a 'colourful' life.

A period photograph of the quayside at Kyrenia, of the Bomonto Bar, its owner H. Sabri Tahir standing at the doorway, people relaxing in the sunshine enjoying a drink and, most interestingly, a Morgan sports car parked on the quayside. Tahir was the agent and importer of Morgans. Unfortunately, the photographer and date of capture is unknown.



The Morgan is a 4/4 (Plus 4 lowline bodied cars were not introduced until after the 1962 Le Mans 24 Hours race in which Chris Lawrence won the 2 Litre Class with his 4/4 low-line bodied Plus 4. Note that the Morgan has a centrally mounted spotlight, bumper over-riders and steel wheels with hubcaps; a badge bar if fitted, is obscured by the trade plate. My 4/4's grill and cowl-box, showed evidence of a centrally mounted spotlight. An accident, whilst on Cyprus, required repairs to A552 by RAF fitters from 103 Maintenance Unit; this necessitated a new front wing and, most probably, a new front bumper; the use of military specification nuts and bolts is evidence that RAF fitters undertook the repairs. Following the accident circa



1962, the over-riders, spotlight and badge bar were not replaced. So, there is more than a strong probability that the white Morgan illustrated in the photograph is newly imported Morgan 4/4 Series II, chassis number A552.

Regardless of any debate whether the car in the Kyrenia quayside photograph is, or is not A552, the discovery of this previously unknown and fascinating photograph after a period of over six decades, is a remarkable find and provides more insight to A552's probable experiences and unique history on the Mediterranean island of Cyprus.

My Old Morgan By Philip Shuttleworth

I always wonder who drives my old cars.

Imagine my surprise, when my old 4/4 cropped up on "Facebook" it is now owned by a company called Classic Car Adventures who have a small fleet of British Classics including TVR, MG and Morgans.
